FIRE SAFETY SURVEY

Before moving into a new home, apartment or dormitory, it is important to conduct a basic fire safety survey. This activity will help you to become familiar with the fire safety features in your future home. The survey may also help you to find potential issues before they become a problem.

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Use the form below to guide you through a fire safety survey of your home. Remember that not all questions will apply to every living situation.
- 2. Complete the survey systematically, we recommend starting on the outside of the building. Next move to the inside of the building to common areas such as hallways and laundry rooms. Finally, look a the individual apartment or dormitory room.
- 3. Any questions that are answered "No" are areas of concern. While these may seem minor issues, they do impact fire safety.
- 4. If you have specific concerns after completing the survey, contact the landlord, property manager, dormitory supervisor etc. for follow up. (If you are already living in the building and they are unwilling to address the noted problems, contact your local fire department for assistance.)
